Although we are only two weeks into a new term, so much learning has happened within and beyond the classroom that I thought I would share some of my highlights.

Our new children who joined preschool and reception last term have settled really quickly and are now enjoying the weekly forest school sessions in our nature area. If you look on X (formally twitter) you can see them toasting brioche, making, and using mud paints and exploring the plants and flowers. Children go out regardless of the weather and even made the most out of the mud slide!

Our year 3 musicians went out on their second trip of the academic year to the newly opened Bristol Beacon to join other children from across the city to learn and perform together. We are proud that every child at MPA is able to listen and appraise different types of music, compose, perform and learn musical notation. Our plan is to increase this with opportunities to perform some of their compositions at 'Pop up events' in the playground.

As part of our Minerva Global Citizen's curriculum, we aspire to teach children how to be responsible and active citizens of the future. This started before the summer with classes going out into the school grounds watering, topping up the bird feeders and litter picking. This continues for one class every week. New for this term is for one class each week to go beyond the school to develop our community links and demonstrate their 'Safe, Respectful, learning'. Westbury on Trym class were the first visiting the Silver Explorers at Hillfields library to talk and read books. Whilst our term 2 focus for Children Learning In Class (CLIC) is maths, you can also look through the class Global Citizen's floor book to see all the amazing learning, pupil voice and photos.

Celebrating Difference is a unit within our **Minerva Global Citizens curriculum** which explores that everyone is unique and should be proud of who they are. Despite our differences we are all children, families and colleagues who are part of the MPA community sharing our school values of **'Safe, Respectful, Learning'**.

It is essential that children and young people learn to accept someone who may have a different lifestyle, appearance, or outlook to them. Together, we learn about and celebrate our similarities and differences.

We teach children about our diverse communities, raise awareness, and promote acceptance around themes such as disability, racism, power, friendships, and conflict. Children learn to accept everyone's right to 'difference', and most year groups explore the concept of bullying – what it is and what it isn't, including cyber and prejudicial bullying. We include a whole school anti-bullying week where we reinforce the key messages including the importance of everyone having trusted safe adults and our definition of bullying 'Several times on purpose STOP' and advice to 'Start telling other people'

We have a parent workshop on bullying on **Friday 17**th **November at 2pm** – all welcome.
