#### GREAT NEWS FOR OUR Y6 CHILDREN AS WE SAY GOODBYE AND GOOD LUCK

We want to share with all families our best ever Y6 SATs results. MPA children have achieved better than national outcomes in reading, writing, maths and SPAG (spelling, punctuation & grammar)

80% achieved combined which means they met the expected standard in reading, writing & maths. expected standard in reading, writing & maths. The outcomes demonstrate great academic achievements for our children as they move on into secondary school. However, at MPA we also value and are proud of our curriculum that provides opportunities for every child to grow and develop personally. Children have all shown they have developed selfagency by taking responsibility to work hard in

school and at home to complete their weekly home learning tasks. There have also been many times when they have needed to be **resilient** and maintain a **growth mindset** when learning or the situation has not been easy. They have also learnt the importance of learning from others both the adults and their peers to establish positive **learner relationship** and connect and **making meaning** across areas of learning.

These outcomes would not have been possible without the **continued support of families** throughout children's primary journey; hearing children read daily, encouraging the completion of home learning and ensuring children are in school as much as possible. We all wish out Year 6 well.
