We are nearly at the end of another fantastic term of learning and enrichment. I love seeing children share their learning and how proud they are of the progress they have made since September. Children who make the most progress are often the children who recognise the importance of our seven Effective Lifelong Learning Inventory (ELLI) skills of self-agency, resilience, perseverance, active curiosity, making links, innovation, and learner relationships. Whilst we have been explicitly teaching ELLI for several years, we still focus on one skill every term. Thank you for supporting your children with home learning such as persevering with their daily reading, encouraging them to find out more by visiting the library and learning with siblings. It all makes such a difference.

Beyond the classroom, our pupil leadership groups have been active. Play leaders have now been appointed and have started their training. They learn a new playground game every Friday then teach and lead other children the following week. Our ECO warriors have been auditing the classroom recycling bins and providing feedback on how we can improve. As it is Safer Internet Day next week, the pupil council have been discussing online safety, considering what it is, the dangers and how we can all stay safe. This will form our new child friendly online safety policy.

As always, it was great to see so many of our families join us this week to find out what the children have been learning: how to look after our mental health and strategies they have learnt for their toolkit. Many children shared what they do already to look after their mental health such as singing, stroking their cat, cycling and reading a good book.
