#### **PSHE**



This term in Personal Social Health Education (PSHE) the focus is Dreams and Goals

This unit of learning is part of our 'Minerva Global Citizen' curriculum where children consider their dreams and aspirations for the future. They look at examples of people who have overcome challenges to achieve success, discuss what they can learn from these stories and how our 'Effective Lifelong Learning Inventory (ELLI)' powers can help i.e our resilient starling and growth

mindset butterfly. Children across the school identify barriers to achievement and discuss how they would overcome them. We believe if someone has something to strive for this encourages a sense of purpose and when they work together it can develop a sense of belonging.

During our weekly in class citizens time on Friday our focus this term is on developing children's mental and emotional health. Last year children learnt and practised strategies such as finger breathing and muscle squeezing. We will build our toolkit this year when we launch 'Children's Mental Health' week in assembly. ## **YEAR 2 - WE ARE HISTORIANS**

Year 2 have recently been to the SS Great Britian as part of our historians learning about inspiring engineers in the Victorian era. We were lucky to have a workshop about Isambard Kingdom Brunel and a guided tour of the ship. We were amazed at the size of the ship and how different the conditions were for rich and poor passengers. We will use this learning next week as we extend our knowledge about inventors and engineers.







# **WE ARE PHILOSOPHERS**

Towards the end of term 2, children from across the school have been Philosophers with many classes looking at Christmas as a celebration. Most have considered how Christians remember the birth of Jesus, whilst Year 1 and 2 classes have also looked into Jewish celebrations including Hannukah. We have been using our Elli power of the Spider to make meaning and links between different religions and celebrations as well as considering ones our own families at home may observe. All children at Minerva are given opportunities to share their own experiences and discuss how this may be similar or different to other children or members of other faiths including Pre-school and Reception' . Year 6 were looking at the differences between celebrations and festivals, and whether you need to be a Christian to celebrate Christmas. Year 5 were looking into Diwali and had some interesting yet challenging discussions together as a class. They are now moving on to look at how the creation story impacts Hindus today. Year 4 were looking at why a Christian festival is so widely celebrated (Christmas) and sharing experiences of Christmas amongst the children, who have many different faiths, cultures and backgrounds, similar to Year 3, who were remembering the story of Christmas. Please do speak to your children about these discussions on celebrations and festivals - maybe you could have a discussion together around the table at dinnertime! The children could demonstrate their oracy skills and SPEAK discussion guidelines to help everyone have a turn to speak. We look forward to hearing how this went!

## YEAR 5- TRIP TO BRISTOL BEACON



Y5 were so lucky to be invited to watch Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra play at Bristol Beacon this term.

As well as an introduction to the or-

chestra, we heard well-known pieces from Moana and Pirates of the Caribbean, sea-themed songs like 'What Shall We Do With the Drunken Sailor' and 'Wellerman', plus some classical music by Debussy and Tchaikovsky.

Our viola players took along their violas and had the opportunity to play along with one of the songs, while the rest of us joined in with body percussion and Makaton sign-alongs. A very inspiring way to see all our music learning being put into practise by a real live orchestra!



#### **PARENT FORUM**

On a regular basis we hold parent forums, which are an opportunity for parents to join and work with us to make Minerva even better. On Friday 17<sup>th</sup> January we held a parent forum and several families joined us to share what they thought was going well and what we could improve. During this time we spent time discussing how positively the Reception children have settled in to school, how supportive the school is when new children join and how the class teachers are supportive with behaviour and spend time talking to parents.

In addition to this, we spent a lot of time discussing the school dinners and how the school dinners are described to their families. We want the school lunches to be enjoyed by as many children as possible so that they can have a warm nutritious meal in the middle of the day to help their growing brains and bodies. To help us know what to improve we are going to be sending out a survey for homework about school dinners. Please take time to complete this with your child so that we get as much feedback as possible so we are able to work with Aspen to make improvements that will make a difference.
