
WE ARE SCIENTISTS YEAR 3

YEAR 5 EXPLORER DOME



From the explosive surface of the Sun to the frozen shell, of our distant tiny dwarf planet of Pluto. Following our tour, we gazed longingly at the night sky. The chance to become daytime star gazers was unforgettable. After out tour of the solar system, we identified the constellations in the night sky. Starting with Orion's belt to finding the North star ending with a dizzying shake of the sky to help us notice how the North star never moves, due to it being locked with the Earth's axis. What an incredible session!
