YEAR 4—LEARNING

Year 4 have loved our PE lessons this term - we have been learning all about cricket. To help us with playing an actual game we have spent time developing our throwing and catching skills to support us with fielding and bowling. We are really looking forward to putting our skills into practice with a game soon.





YEAR 6 STONE AGE WORKSHOP

Earlier in the term, Year 6 had a virtual talk from an archaeologist about the Stone Age, with a particular focus on our local area's history. We learnt a lot about Stonehenge and were able to ask questions and find out about its significance. We also saw artefacts such as spearheads, arrows, mammoth tusks and replicas of the first types of metal tools and weapons that signified the end of the Stone Age and the beginning of the Iron Ages. Finally, we were able to discuss 'Cheddar Man' and the children wrote fact files that demonstrated what they had learnt about historical significance and civilisations.

'Cheddar Man'

Cheddar Man is the first ever fully complete skeleton found in the ancient times in England, Somerset, in the Cheddar Gorge. He was found in 1903 by some workers who were digging for a new drainage system and they found his skeleton, curled up in ball, in Gough's Cave.

FACTS:

- Cheddar Man was a Mesolithic Hunter-Gatherer.
- Cheddar Man was from the Mesolithic Era.
- When he was found, almost all of his teeth were perfectly white.
- With the power of AI, scientists have created images of how they thought he looked like from his DNA.
- He lived around 10,000 years ago and died in around 7100BC
- Scientists thought that his diet consisted of meat, berries and grains since his teeth were in near perfect condition.
- 'Cheddar Man' was lactose intolerant, therefore he could not eat or drink any dairy as his body could not digest it.



In year 1 we have been scientists and exploring magnets. The children really enjoyed exploring what materials were magnetic. Using their scientific knowledge the children experimented making the magnets move without touching them! We even pretended to do magic tricks!









MINERVA GLOBAL CITIZEN - RELATIONSHIPS



Healthy relationships are crucial to living a happy and fulfilling life, that includes positive peer relationships, safe online interactions, relationships with different adults in school and at home and those within our local community. This puzzle will help students understand the value of friendship and family. It will also

teach them conflict resolution and communication skills to help when navigating through the adult world.

Learning is progressive and age appropriate from reception to year 6. This unit teaches children the essential building blocks and characteristics of positive relationships. We believe that children should learn about relationships as well as the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up in an age-appropriate way. The unit provides lots of opportunity for our children to practise and demonstrate the *Effective Lifelong Learning Inventory* skill of learner relationships (bee).
